

Eccles Sixth Form College offers an academic curriculum designed to inspire and nurture students so they can reach their full potential.

WHERE DO YOU START?

WHAT DO YOU WANT TO DO WHEN YOU LEAVE COLLEGE?

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Advanced level 3 courses require a minimum of 5 grade 4s (including mathematics and/or English).

Higher grades may be required in specialised curriculum areas.

VOCATIONAL COURSES

We offer courses from level 1 - 3 in a range of subject areas. Vocational courses such as BTECs are designed to give you hands-on practical skills within a specific industry sector.

You will be taught by expert teachers within industry standard facilities, ensuring you learn the skills required to progress further. Our outstanding science provision has been recognised nationally and has led to students gaining employment at prestigious organisations.

VOCATIONAL A-LEVELS

These advanced level courses allow students the academic rigour of A-level coupled with the practical elements of vocational studies.

Students can select a combination of courses that suit their needs and aspirations. Subjects offered include criminology, animal management, business, applied science and sport.

In order to access these courses, mathematics and English must be achieved at a minimum of a grade 4 at GCSE.

ECCLES ELITE PROGRAMME

This advanced level programme of study provides students with the opportunity to study whilst completing an internship in a related organisation. Students can gain additional qualifications, such as first aid and membership to professional bodies such as the Football Association. This will ensure students stand out when applying for further study or competitive careers.

In order to access these courses students must be successful through a rigorous selection process. They must also achieve mathematics and English at a minimum of a grade 4 at GCSE.

STUDIED SPORT

DESTINATION: PROFESSIONAL FOOTBALLER

Scott kicked off his career whilst studying BTEC Sport at Eccles. A hugely successful stint at Rochdale attracted many suitors, with Championship club Brentford successfully securing his signature in 2014. Over the next 3 seasons at Griffin Park he scored 21 goals in 33 games securing a lucrative £15million move to Aston Villa; further recognition came in 2018 by way of an international call up with the Republic of Ireland. Most recently, Scott scored the goal that sealed promotion to the Premier League for Sheffield United this season. And the talent clearly runs in the family, with Scott's brother Liam, also a former Eccles sport student, captaining Salford City Football Club to promotion to the English Football League this season.



EMMIE-ROSE EASTWOOD

STUDIED SPORT

Emmie is a professional water polo player, who has travelled the world competing with the Great Britain's Under 18's Women Water Polo Team. The team brought home a gold medal from the English School Swimming Association Water Polo Tournament in Malta and more recently competed in the European Championships in Serbia, coming sixth and qualifying for the FINA World Championships (the international swimming federation). This is the highest achievement for any GB squad in this tournament.

STUDIED AT ECCLES SIXTH FORM COLLEGE

Upon completing his A-Levels at Eccles College in 1990, Gareth studied at King's College, Cambridge, where he read history. After graduating Gareth qualified as a lawyer and was called to the Bar by Middle Temple in 1997. He currently practises as a barrister, specialising in personal injury and clinical negligence, at No. 5 Chambers, in Birmingham and London. Gareth developed an abiding interest in politics whilst at Eccles Sixth Form College. He has served as a local councillor in both London and Birmingham, including a period as the Cabinet Member for Education on Lambeth Council.

VOCATIONAL A-LEVELS

At Eccles Sixth Form College students can choose to study three vocational subjects at one time on our Vocational A-level Programme. You will have the opportunity to study a combination of three of the following subjects over a two year period.







A NEW, UNIQUE QUALIFICATION

Eccles Sixth Form College is proud to offer Vocational A-levels. A qualification that allows students to receive 'the academic rigour of studying A-levels, coupled with the practical elements of vocational studies'.

You may be wondering: what's next for me? By law, all young people under the age of 18 must either remain in full-time education, start an apprenticeship or spend a minimum of 20 hours per week working or volunteering, whilst undertaking part-time education or training.

For many, college or sixth form is the obvious option, but with an abundance of courses and qualifications available, 'what's next' it is not always the easiest decision to make.

Many decide to go down the more academic route and study A-levels. A-levels give students the opportunity to study multiple subjects and in more depth than at GCSE. A-levels are known for their academic structure, often assessed by exams or a mixture of exams and coursework.

However, A-levels aren't for everyone and vocational courses can offer an alternative, but equally valued qualification for those who don't feel A-levels are for them.

WHY A VOCATIONAL A-LEVEL?

Vocational pathways offer more practical, hands-on training and often only in one subject area as opposed to

three of four. They are ideal for those who don't generally do well in exams and many, who might not reach their full potential studying A-levels, flourish on vocational courses.

Furthermore, employers and universities merit vocational qualifications equally to A-levels, which is demonstrated in the UCAS Tariff Point Tables.

WHAT IS A VOCATIONAL A-LEVEL?

Jane Roebuck, Head of Eccles Sixth Form College, said: "Vocational A-levels are an exciting and dynamic new addition to our already extensive vocational offer. These advanced-level courses provide students with the academic rigour of A-level coupled with the practical elements of vocational study.

"Students can select a combination of three courses that suit their needs and aspirations. Subjects offered include psychology, animal management, business, applied science and sport.

"This will be the first time that students will be able to study psychology within a vocational context, which means there will be an opportunity to study the theoretical aspects within industry settings."

ANIMAL MANAGEMENT

You will study units such as animal behaviour and welfare, animal training and animal biology, all in our industry-standard animal centre.

APPLIED SCIENCE

Areas of study will include working in the science industry, fundamentals of biology, chemistry and physics, as well as practical techniques.

BUSINESS STUDIES

The course will cover units such as the business environment, public relations and marketing.

CRIMINOLOGY

The Diploma in Criminology will give you an in-depth knowledge and understanding of concepts linked to the criminal justice system.

HEALTH & SOCIAL CARE

This course places emphasis on developing skills as well as academic achievement and you will engage in practical activities, learning from Health & Social Care practitioners.

PROTECTIVE SERVICES

This course is designed for those learners that want to pursue a career in protective services, particularly the police. Units of study include criminology, behaviour and citizenship, and outdoor activities and fitness.

PSYCHOLOGY

This course will include units such as brain and behaviour and the study of psychological theorists.

SPORT

Units of study will include anatomy for sport and exercise, physiology and psychology. You will also have access to the state-of-the-art-facilities including our brand new gym and sports science laboratory.

TRAVEL & TOURISM

You will investigate the travel and tourism sector, aviation and marketing of the travel industry.

ANIMAL MANAGEMENT: VOCATIONAL A-LEVEL

WHY IS THIS COURSE RIGHT FOR ME?

Vocational A-levels allow you to combine multiple vocational subjects in the same way you would in traditional A-levels. Animal management students will develop an advanced understanding of animal biology, health and welfare, whilst developing practical skills in the industry-standard animal facility.

WHAT TOPICS WILL I STUDY?

Students will explore the principles of animal biology, anatomy and physiology and animal welfare. Hands-on practical skills are developed during sessions in our animal centre, laboratories and veterinary nursing suite.

ASSESSMENT

- Written assessments
- Practical assessments and portfolios of evidence
- Some units may be assessed via examination

ENRICHMENT

- Visiting speakers and demonstrations from experts, such as veterinary surgeons and animal physiotherapists
- Visits to large collections, such as Chester Zoo and Blue Planet Aquarium
- Residentials in the Lake District, to study wildlife and conservation
- Zoo club events throughout the year

WHAT CAN I DO NEXT?

Following the completion of Vocational A-levels, most students continue their studies in Higher Education either, with Eccles Sixth Form College's University Centre on our impressive range of Higher National Certificates, or at other universities.



APPLIED SCIENCE: VOCATIONAL A-LEVEL

WHY IS THIS COURSE RIGHT FOR ME?

This subject complements a range of other Vocational A-levels for you to enjoy learning science in a highly practical pathway. This course is exceptionally useful if you would like to enhance your understanding of biology, chemistry or physics in a practical learning environment.

WHAT TOPICS WILL I STUDY?

You will study the fundamental aspects of biology, chemistry and physics, including a range of scientific practicals in the lab.

ASSESSMENT

- Written assignments
- Practical assessments in the form of experiments and primary research
- Presentations
- Laboratory practicals and write-ups

ENRICHMENT

- Science Society events, focusing on careers in Science
- University visits
- Trips to large science companies, to experience the industry in action
- Opportunities to join the STEM Academy

WHAT CAN I DO NEXT?

Applied science combines well with all of our other vocational A-level courses. Depending on the subject combination, students progress to study a variety of pathways in Higher Education.



BUSINESS STUDIES: VOCATIONAL A-LEVEL

WHY IS THIS COURSE RIGHT FOR ME?

The Level 3 Certificate in Business Studies is the equivalent to one A-level subject and combines well with the other vocational A-levels we have on offer. You will learn how organisations operate in theory and how they function in practice.

WHAT TOPICS WILL I STUDY?

You will study a range of topics including: business environment; business resources and communication; introduction to marketing and creative product promotion.

ASSESSMENT

- Written assessments
- Practical assessments and portfolios of evidence
- Presentations to staff and students
- Synoptic assessments

ENRICHMENT

- Visiting speakers and workshops from business experts, including Jardine Motors and Cosmopolitan magazine
- Visits to KPMG, Price Waterhouse Coopers and the Bank of New York Mellon
- Work placement opportunities at prestigious organisations, such as ITV, Peel Media and the NHS.

WHAT CAN I DO NEXT?

This course will give you a good grounding in becoming a successful business manager or running and developing your own business. Alternatively, you may decide to continue your education and move onto Higher Education either with us or at a different university.

CRIMINOLOGY: VOCATIONAL A-LEVEL

WHY IS THIS COURSE RIGHT FOR ME?

This vocational A-level is designed for 16-18 year olds who want to access further study in the area of criminal justice. The Diploma in Criminology will give you an in-depth knowledge and understanding of concepts linked to the criminal justice system. It is designed to be studied alongside other vocational A-levels and compliments many combinations.

WHAT TOPICS WILL I STUDY?

You will explore many areas, including the changing awareness of crime, criminological theories, crime scene to courtroom and crime and punishment. Each topic provides students with an introduction to criminal justice and the social humanities sector.

ENRICHMENT

- Criminology residential in London to visit the Old Bailey
- Visiting experts, from areas such as mental health and psychology
- Fundraising activities within the local community
- Workshops from industry professionals

WHAT CAN I DO NEXT?

Students who achieve this qualification progress onto study at university. The course is particularly suitable for degrees in youth work, criminology, law, humanities, human rights, social policy, probation, social work, psychology or sociology.



PSYCHOLOGY: VOCATIONAL A-LEVEL

WHY IS THIS COURSE RIGHT FOR ME?

This vocational A-level allows you to study psychology with a vocational context and can also be combined with two other subject areas. You will develop knowledge and understanding of key approaches and theories in psychology and apply these to issues in contemporary society.

WHAT TOPICS WILL I STUDY?

You will explore many concepts, including psychological approaches and applications, conducting psychological research, health psychology and an introduction to psychopathology.

ENRICHMENT

- Criminology residential in London to visit the Old Bailey
- Visiting experts from areas such as mental health and psychology
- Fundraising activities within the local community
- Workshops from industry professionals

WHAT CAN I DO NEXT?

You may be considering continuing your study of psychology by progressing to Higher Education. Some of our students have progressed to degree courses in occupational health, psychology and criminology and psychology and counselling.



PROTECTIVE SERVICES: VOCATIONAL A-LEVEL

WHY IS THIS COURSE RIGHT FOR ME?

This course combines the theory and practical elements of successful employees in the protective services. Working in the police service, fire service, or armed services requires discipline, commitment, and a desire to help others. You will find the course stimulating and varied, as it combines classroom-based study with outdoor activities and group work. You will also develop your personal effectiveness, decision making, teamwork, leadership, and communication skills.

WHAT TOPICS WILL I STUDY?

You will study a wide range of topics, such as leadership, team development, outdoor adventurous activities and fitness, criminology and behaviour and citizenship. This subject will complement other social sciences vocational A-levels as well as sport and exercise science.

ENRICHMENT

- Duke of Edinburgh's award
- Visiting speakers from a variety of protective service backgrounds
- Opportunities to take part in activities such as water sports and rock climbing
- Residential visit to Poland
- British Army and Royal Marines residentials
- Greater Manchester Police recruitment process guidance, where desired

WHAT CAN I DO NEXT?

Typically, learners would progress onto Higher Education courses in Policing, Criminology, or Sociology. Students will also have the opportunity to progress onto our own Higher National Certificate in Policing at Eccles Sixth Form College.



SPORT: VOCATIONAL A-LEVEL

WHY IS THIS COURSE RIGHT FOR ME?

This Vocational A-level combines the theoretical aspects of sport with practical skills development. You will study a variety of topics which will equip you with the necessary knowledge and skills to progress onto Higher Education or employment in the sector.

WHAT TOPICS WILL I STUDY?

This course covers a range of topics, such as anatomy and physiology for sport and exercise, psychology for sport and exercise, fitness training and programming, sports nutrition and sports.

ENRICHMENT

- Work opportunities with the Manchester United Foundation, Salford Community Leisure and Salford Youth Alliance
- Opportunities to take part in activities, such as water sports and rock climbing
- Visits to high profile sporting events

WHAT CAN I DO NEXT?

Many of our students progress to university to study subjects such as sports injuries, coaching and development, leisure and the fitness industry, sports management and media. A growing number of students choose to stay with us and complete a Higher National Certificate in sport and exercise science.



TRAVEL & TOURISM: VOCATIONAL A-LEVEL

WHY IS THIS COURSE RIGHT FOR ME?

This course is for you if you wish to continue your education through a work-related pathway in the travel and tourism industry. The travel and tourism vocational A-level is taught by highly experienced professionals, who have extensive experience working in the aviation, tourism and hospitality sector.

WHAT TOPICS WILL I STUDY?

You will learn in depth about the travel industry and the roles of different organisations within it. You will develop your skills in how to use maps and atlases to research and locate global destinations, geographical features and what makes them appealing to visitors.

ENRICHMENT

- Visiting speakers and workshops from travel experts including Ink Travel and Radisson
- Work placements opportunities in large organisations
- Studying popular visitor attractions such as Chester Zoo. Chill Factor-e and Old Trafford

WHAT CAN I DO NEXT?

A qualification in travel and tourism is highly valued by many universities and employers alike. Students going on to Higher Education often move into specific areas of the industry.



HEALTH & SOCIAL CARE: VOCATIONAL A-LEVEL

WHY IS THIS COURSE RIGHT FOR ME?

The Extended Certificate is equivalent to one A-level and is for those students who are interested in Health or Social Care and wish to develop personal and professional skills. This course allows you implement care values, such as equal opportunities. When studying this course, it places emphasis on developing skills as well as academic achievement and you will engage in practical activities, learning from Health & Social Care practitioners.

WHAT TOPICS WILL I STUDY?

You will study units such as the human lifespan development, meeting individual care and support and working in Health and Social Care.

ENRICHMENT

- First aid training
- Fundraising activities within the local community
- Workshops from industry professionals

WHAT CAN I DO NEXT?

The Health & Social Care course provides preparation for a wide range of careers within the care field, including nursing, physiotherapy, occupational therapy, social work and working with children in a variety of settings. Skills gained on these courses are also transferable to a range of other careers.



THE ECCLES SIXTH FORM COLLEGE ANIMAL CENTRE





The state-of-the-art Animal Centre at Eccles Sixth Form College has received significant investment and development over the past few years, to provide a centre of excellence for students wishing to study on a range of our animal, equine, veterinary nursing and science courses. The college has over 250 different species of both domestic and exotic animals in its state of the art indoor and outdoor facilities.

Students have access to a diverse and unique selection of birds, mammals, reptiles, amphibians, invertebrates and marine life. As part of their chosen filed of study, students gain a vast amount of hands-on experience and the opportunity work with animals to complement their classroom studies and develop essential practical skills.

The Veterinary Nursing Department is well equipped with its own veterinary nursing surgery, laboratories and all of the equipment you will use in practice.

The Equine Department complete the practical elements of their studies at Ryders Farm Equestrian Centre, which is home to over 52 horses and ponies and set in 60 acres of land. Students can develop their practical equitation and husbandry skills, using the outstanding facilities such as indoor and outdoor arena, cross country field, horse walker and specialist classrooms.

Ryders Farm Equestrian Centre is a British Horse Society Where to Train Centre and promotes the development of Eccles Sixth Form College students to British Horse Society standards.

UNIQUE OPPORTUNITIES FOR STUDENTS

Studying within the Animal Department at Eccles Sixth Form College offers many unique opportunities, not offered at other establishments. From being able to handle endangered and rare species, to carrying out one-on-one de-sensitisation training with some of the College's friendliest inhabitants. This training not only provides stimulation for the animals, but also makes it easier for students to work with the animals, health checking them for their studies. Students will have the opportunity to work with prestigious organisations across the country as well as work with conversation and wildlife organisations on projects such as the European Endangered Species Programme.

The Animal Management Course is well established at Eccles Sixth Form College and the extensive curriculum delivery is underpinned by our outstanding facilities. This course is designed to give you the relevant knowledge and specialist skills that will allow you to be successful in your next steps in education or employment. You will develop and expand your knowledge in all aspects of animal management, gaining hands on practical experience in our new industry-standard facilities.

WHAT TOPICS WILL I STUDY?

You will study a range of animal collections, including large and small mammals, exotics, and aquatics. Units of study are selected to allow you to develop a broad understanding of all aspects of animal management, including animal health and welfare, husbandry and sciences of domestic, exotic and wildlife species. Hands-on practical skills are developed during sessions in our animal centre, laboratories and veterinary nursing suite. All students complete work experience as part of their course.



WHY IS THIS COURSE RIGHT FOR ME?

This intermediate level course is designed for those young people who wish to gain a specialised qualification in animal nursing. It is designed to develop your practical skills in animal care and management, while offering additional opportunities to hone your customer service skills in a retail environment. You will develop your theoretical knowledge, whilst gaining hands on practical experience in our new industry standard animal facility and fully equipped veterinary nursing suite.

WHAT TOPICS WILL I STUDY?

You will study a wide range of units that will expand your understanding of delivering treatments to animals. Additionally, you will investigate animal accommodation, infection control, animal nutrition and animal anatomy and physiology. You will also gain work experience in the veterinary industry, which allows you to put your skills into practice.



WHY IS THIS COURSE RIGHT FOR ME?

On completion of this course, you will be fully qualified to work as a registered veterinary nurse. This highly selective course is designed to equip you with the skills and knowledge you need to pursue a career in this highly competitive sector. Work placement is an essential element of this course and you will be assessed both in placement and in college. You will develop your theoretical knowledge whilst gaining hands on practical experience in our new industry standard animal facility and fully equipped veterinary nursing suite.

WHAT TOPICS WILL I STUDY?

The specialist units are selected to ensure that you cover all aspects of veterinary nursing, including: applied animal welfare; diagnostic imaging and laboratory diagnostics; small animal critical care and life skills essential for your professional development. You will be allocated a clinical coach to guide you in practice and our experienced veterinary nursing teachers will ensure that you develop all of the skills you need.

GIVING STUDENTS THE SKILLS EMPLOYERS NEED

T-levels are the technical equivalent to A-levels. T-levels combine classroom-based learning with a long-term industry work placement that enables students to put into practice the skills they have learnt in the classroom in a real-life working situation.

Each T-level course includes a 315-hour industry placement with an employer that aligns to your area of study and the career path that you aim to succeed in.

COURSES AVAILABLE:

T-LEVEL IN HEALTH NURSING CADETS

The topics studied on this two-year T-level in health and social care are designed to give you an insight into aspects of the healthcare sector. You will study modules such as the health sector, providing person-centered care, health and wellbeing and science concepts. Learning will include:

- Written and synoptic assessments
- Case study analysis
- Independent research and presentations
- Professional discussions
- A 45-day industry placement in your chosen industry or occupation provided by the NHS

Entry Requirements: five grade 4s at GCSE, which must include English, science and

T-LEVEL IN LABORATORY SCIENCE

During this two-year qualification, students will spend 80% of their time in the classroom and 20% of their time on a 45-day industry placement with an employer who will help you develop the skills and knowledge you'll need in the industry. Learning will include:

- Health, safety and environmental regulations
- Chemical, pharmaceutical, biotechnological products
- Nuclear and analytical services
- Lab-based investigations
- Scientific experimentation

Entry Requirements: five grade 4s at GCSE, which must include English, science and mathematics.



T-LEVEL IN BUSINESS & ADMINISTRATION

This course will help students develop their skills and prepare them for the next level. It's a two-year course designed to get them T-level ready. It will give them relevant knowledge, practical and study skills, work experience and support in Business and Administration and gives them the best chance of progressing onto a degree level course or employment. Learning includes:

- Digital skills
- Business processes and change
- Systems, finance and legislation
- Project and data management

Entry Requirements: five grade 4s at GCSE, which must include English and mathematics.

TRANSITION COURSES

Each of these courses are also available as a transition course, a preparatory programme for level 2 students who aspire to progress onto a T-Level. If you have not already achieved English and maths at GCSE, you will study these alongside the transition course.



LEVELS OF ACADEMIC STUDY

LEVEL 1 FOUNDATION

Foundation level courses are the beginning of a qualification. They are designed to build a student's skill-set in a certain subject area by providing an introduction, building a foundation for further study, or helping gain future employment.

LEVEL 2 INTERMEDIATE

Intermediate level courses offer more units of study in a subject area and a variety of topics. This level can be studied as a follow on from a level 1 course or a student can start at this level if they meet the entry requirements.

Four Grade 3s at GCSE



LEVEL 3 ADVANCED

Advanced level courses are more difficult in terms of knowledge needed to complete the course. This level will focus on a student's academic skills, helping them to evaluate, analyse and describe their subject area. This level can be studied as a follow on from level 2 course or students can start at this level if they meet the entry requirements.

Five Grade 4s at GCSE, with at least a 4 in English and mathematics







LEVEL 4 FOUNDATION DEGREE YEAR 1 HNC

A level 4 qualification is equivalent to the first year of a degree.

Entry requirements dependant on UCAS tariff points or current work experience





LEVEL 5 FOUNDATION DEGREE YEAR 2 HND

Level 5 is equivalent to studying a second year of a degree.

Entry requirements dependant on UCAS tariff points or current work experience



LEVEL 6 HONOURS DEGREE

Level 6 is the final year of a degree.

Entry requirements dependant on prior qualifications, UCAS tariff points or work experience

BECOME AN APPRENTICE

We are a leading provider for apprenticeships in Greater Manchester, supporting around 1,500 apprentices and 450+ employers in the region. The opportunities available are extensive and the skills you will learn are highly sought after by industry. We have a fantastic team of specialist, apprenticeship delivery staff.
